I am proud to say that volunteers are hard at work repairing wheel chairs for veterans in need. We still have a few wheelchairs, along with some other medical equipment we be happy to put in use. Just come by, and sign one out. We only ask that the person is a member of our Post, and when the item is no longer needed, it is returned so that it may be signed out to the next person in need.

Due to waiting list with meals on wheels, and other services, I am concerned many veterans and their families are going without. Please, if you know of a member, or past member that is need of assistance please contact my office. We have a great team of people helping our Legion through various activities, from outreach to shut-in veterans, assigning wheel chairs, mowing lawns and linking them to services in the area.

The funds for donations come from our Bingo Hall use. It is available for outside activities not just for Post's use if you know of someone looking to rent at hall for family reunion, arts and crafts or large activities, please give our office a call. The funds help us provide more assistance to our community, in addition to scholarships.

Since the entire building has gone "non" smoking, we have purchased a new backdoor, which is to be installed. This will help with the influx of traffic moving from inside to outside to enter the designated smoking area. We have enough funds to buy the material to begin building our Smoking building just outside where the tent is standing.
